Dear parishioners,

A PEARL BEYOND PRICE CONSECRATED LIFE TODAY

We admire people who can set their hearts on a project, on a life's work, on a relationship, and can give their whole selves to the fulfilment of this desire. In our Catholic church, we can admire those women and men who have consecrated their lives fully to God. They have made God their heart's desire, and seek to live their relationship with God as deeply as they can.

Consecrated life has many good points. One good point is that it acts like a signpost to the rest of us, who can get trapped in our busy-ness, so that we are reminded that for all people the most important relationship is our relationship with God. This beautiful model is not a model of sporting or financial achievement: consecrated life speaks to us of the heart fully committed to God.

Consecrated life is a contradiction. Some of us put ourselves or our families first. The consecrated woman or man puts God first. Some of us want to be famous, on the centre stage or the centre court. But the consecrated person has no such desire, because the consecrated person wants all praise to go to their beloved God. Some of us want to have power over others, but the consecrated person wants only to serve their beloved God, and serve others in ways which serve God. Consecrated life really contradicts the false idols of our times.

Some men and women may live out their consecrated life as hermits, limiting as far as possible their contact with the world. Yet even when seemingly alone with God, they are still connected with us through their formal consecration in the Church. And their life is not easy: we can pray for them just as they pray for us. We belong together in the Church.

Other women and men live their consecrated lives enmeshed in the world. As lay people with jobs and families and everyday tasks, they still consecrate their lives to God in the special circumstances in which they live. Rather than dividing their hearts, they find that giving the fullness of their hearts to God flows over into love of neighbour.

On this day, established by Pope John Paul II nearly thirty years ago as a celebration of consecrated life, we rejoice in our unity with all those who hear the call to this full commitment to God, and respond to it with full hearts. It is not easy to respond to this call – after all, consecrated men and women are real men and women! May their lives and ours flow together in the radiant joy of God's love.

THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025 Pilgrims of Hope on the Path of Peace

CELEBRATION OF CONSECRATED LIFE 2 FEBRUARY 2025

Today, 2nd February 2025, we celebrate and give thanks for the contribution the Religious men and women have made, and are still making, to the life of the Archdiocese of Adelaide. There are also some lay women and men who are living a consecrated life. We also remember and celebrate their contribution.

Members of the Consecrated Life, as 'Pilgrims of Hope' on the path of peace, have served the Church in South Australia as Founders and Leaders in education, health and aged care, services for the homeless and destitute, those with disabilities, and our Aboriginal Communities. Most of these roles are now assumed by lay people.

Education: Congregations contributed to a variety of schools in rural and metropolitan areas, including parochial schools, colleges, boarding schools, schools for children with disabilities, and First Nations people in their own lands.

Health: The Little Company of Mary established Calvary Hospital and a hospice for the dying. Other Orders, such as Little Sisters of the Poor, Sisters of St Joseph and the Franciscan Sisters contributed to Aged Care.

Social Services and Pastoral Care: Congregations founded and supported facilities for the homeless, for example, the Daughters of Charity in Hutt Street. St Joseph's Refuge was opened by St Mary Mackillop in Fullarton in 1900, to provide accommodation for unmarried mothers and destitute women.

This outreach was continued by the Daughters of Charity. There were Orphanages at Goodwood and Largs Bay run by the Sisters of Mercy and the Sisters of St Joseph. There has been a continuous ministry of Priests and Religious who have accompanied their fellow countrymen and women as they migrated to Australia. Many priests, brothers and sisters also came as Missionaries. Religious in more recent times have contributed to the development of Parishes in roles such as Pastoral Associates. We all owe a great debt to the Religious Communities for their contributions to the foundation of our Church in South Australia.

Feast of St Josephine Bakhita Mass – Sunday, February 9

You are invited to join the African Catholic Community to celebrate the Feast of St Josephine Bakhita Eucharistic celebration on Sunday, February 9 at 2.30pm, in St Francis Xavier's Cathedral. All are welcome. Pope Francis has designated the feast day as the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human trafficking.



Pope Francis has designated 8th February, the feast of St Josephine Bakhita, as the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking following a request from Talitha Kum, the worldwide Network of Consecrated Life Against Human Trafficking.

Born in 1869 in Sudan, Josephine knew the pain and sorrow of losing her freedom, when at 7 years of age she was taken by slave traders. She was bought and sold many times in the following decade. Taken to Italy by a family, who 'owned' her, she met the Canossian Daughters of Charity, became a Catholic and joined the Canossian congregation. She died in 1947 and was canonized in 2000.

<u>NOTIZIE ITALIANE</u> Domenica 2 Febbraio 2025 (Luca 2, 22-40)

Quando furono compiuti i giorni della loro purificazione rituale, secondo la legge di Mosè, Maria e Giuseppe portarono il bambino a Gerusalemme per presentarlo al Signore e per offrire in sacrificio una coppia di tortore o due giovani colombi, come prescrive la legge del Signore. Ora a Gerusalemme c'era un uomo di nome Simeone, uomo giusto e pio, che aspettava la consolazione d'Israele, e lo Spirito Santo era su di lui. Lo Spirito Santo gli aveva preannunciato che non avrebbe visto la morte senza prima aver veduto il Cristo del Signore. Mosso dallo Spirito, si recò al tempio e, mentre i genitori vi portavano il bambino Gesù per fare ciò che la Legge prescriveva a suo riguardo, anch'egli lo accolse tra le braccia e benedisse Dio, dicendo: "Ora puoi lasciare, o Signore, che il tuo servo vada in pace, secondo la tua parola, perché i miei occhi hanno visto la tua salvezza, preparata da te davanti a tutti i popoli: luce per rivelarti alle genti e gloria del tuo popolo, Israele". Parola del Signore.

I riti di presentazione e di purificazione che la liturgia ci propone oggi possiamo definirli un'anticipazione del sacramento del nostro battesimo e della penitenza. Maria e Giuseppe e con loro lo stesso Gesù, si assoggettano umilmente ad una legge antica. Quando però ad essere presentato al tempio è il bambino Gesù e a chiedere la purificazione è la vergine Madre, cambiano sostanzialmente i significati di quei riti. Diventano una solenne celebrazione e un'occasione per ripetere a tutti gli uomini che la luce di Dio ha inondato il mondo con la nascita e nella presentazione del Signore nel Tempio del suo Figlio. Lo Spirito Santo pervade l'anima di due santi vegliardi, Simeone e Anna, i quali aspettavano la redenzione di Israele. Alla vista del bambino profetizzano e cantano. Diventano i primi testimoni della fede. Simeone prende fra le sue braccia il figlio di Dio e si sente totalmente appagato nelle sue più intime e profonde attese al punto di desiderare e chiedere solo il riposo eterno nella pace dei giusti poiché - egli dice - "i miei occhi hanno visto la salvezza". Il bambino Gesù viene poi definito Luce delle genti e gloria del popolo d'Israele.
