#### **ASH WEDNESDAY- A FOCUS ON GIVING** (Giving up- Giving to- Giving in)

Dear beloved Parishioners and Friends,

Life offers opportunities to embrace vulnerability, whether in relationships or career risks. Yet, unchosen vulnerabilities, like losing a loved one or receiving bad news from a doctor, present tough challenges. By accepting our brokenness, we can become our most authentic selves. The ashes of Ash Wednesday remind us that vulnerability is essential to our human/spiritual journey.

#### A Focus on Giving

Recognising our brokenness indicates a desire for healing, highlighting the lasting significance of Lenten practices such as fasting (Giving up), almsgiving (Giving to), and prayer (Giving in). These traditions remain highly relevant today and maybe more essential than ever. By releasing our dependence on unnecessary comforts, offering support to those in need, and embracing God's presence in our lives, we can confront our shortcomings. This process helps us become more aware of the blessings intertwined with our human experience, fostering personal growth and resilience.

Giving up: Fasting, once a revered spiritual practice that has waned in popularity, is experiencing a revival, though often in a less meaningful context. "Intermittent fasting" has taken the spotlight across nutrition websites and best-selling books. However, when we view fasting not merely as a weight-loss strategy but as an opportunity to release our dependence on unnecessary comforts, it transforms into a profound act of prayer. Giving up desserts for Lent can indeed be a moment of reflection on what we can live without. Yet, there is a deeper power in choosing to "fast" from gossip, frivolous spending, or the need to always have the last word. Fasting allows us to embrace our own "lacking" in a way that fosters genuine transformation.

Giving to: Almsgiving, the act of giving money or food to those in need, is a powerful traditional Lenten practice with profound relevance today. It reminds us that we are not alone in our vulnerabilities; the world is filled with others who experience their own struggles. By reaching out to them in their time of need, we honour their pain and stand in solidarity with their brokenness. In doing so, we take meaningful steps toward healing our own wounds.

Giving in: Prayer as a spiritual practice is timeless and enduring. Throughout the year, and especially during Lent, it serves as a powerful means of engaging in divine community. By lifting our own broken pieces and those of others in prayer, we embrace rather than shy away from the vulnerable aspects of our lives. Prayer forges connections among us and with God, weaving our individual brokenness into a beautiful tapestry of wholeness.

Ash Wednesday, while often viewed with heaviness, though solemn, presents a beautiful invitation to embrace our brokenness and vulnerability. It fosters a deep sense of solidarity with others in their struggles. This day serves as a powerful reminder of God's unwavering readiness to heal our wounds, calling us to welcome divine transformation and reassuring us that we are never alone on our journey.

#### **NOTIZIE ITALIANE** Domenica 2 Marzo 2025 (Luca 6, 39-45)

"Può forse un cieco guidare un altro cieco? Non cadranno tutti e due in un fosso? Un discepolo non è più del maestro; ma ognuno, che sia ben preparato, sarà come il suo maestro. Perché guardi la pagliuzza che è nell'occhio del tuo fratello e non ti accorgi della trave che è nel tuo occhio? Come puoi dire al tuo fratello: "Fratello, lascia che tolga la pagliuzza che è nel tuo occhio", mentre tu stesso non vedi la trave che è nel tuo occhio? Ipocrita! Togli prima la trave dal tuo occhio e allora ci vedrai bene per togliere la pagliuzza dall'occhio del tuo fratello. Non vi è albero buono che produca un frutto cattivo, né vi è d'altronde albero cattivo che produca un frutto buono. Ogni albero infatti si riconosce dal suo frutto: non si raccolgono fichi dagli spini, né si vendemmia uva da un rovo. L'uomo buono dal buon tesoro del suo cuore trae fuori il bene; l'uomo cattivo dal suo cattivo tesoro trae fuori il male: la sua bocca infatti esprime ciò che dal cuore sovrabbonda". Parola del Signore.

«Io sono la luce del mondo». È una delle affermazioni solenni di Gesù. La sua Luce è la divina sublime sapienza, è la Verità che fuga le tenebre e gli errori del nostri spirito. In questo contesto meditiamo il Vangelo di oggi: «Può forse un cieco guidare un altro cieco»? Proprio a favore di un cieco nato Gesù opera uno dei suoi più portentosi miracoli, siamo però consapevoli che il miracolo per eccellenza che a tutti ridona la vista, riguarda l'Opera della redenzione universale, il perdono, il recupero della "vista" dell'anima.
