GOD OF SURPRISES

God is a God of surprises.

Beautiful surprises.

Surprises of love and forgiveness.

Just when you think you know it all, God turns the idea on its head and surprises us.

Whether it is making a way for us in our personal wilderness, or creating impossible, powerful rivers in our private deserts. Nothing is impossible for God. Even the Prophet Isaiah knew this as he boldly proclaimed a powerful, living God. The First Reading is a reminder: whatever you face, whatever challenges you, God is with you. The only thing that undermines this is personal doubt.

The Second Reading is a timely reminder that Jesus is our goal in life. Without the Lord, we become impoverished. But our eternal hope remains in sharing our lives with Jesus – with faith. Is this your reality today?

The Gospel of the woman caught in adultery is complex. It takes two to commit adultery, yet only one is brought before Jesus. Immediately, the Lord of Righteousness knows that it is a set up – for him and for the woman. We all know what a 'set up' looks like, sounds like and feels like. When you are targeted, you know. It was going to be their 'gotcha' moment of trapping two people: the woman and the Lord.

What surprises us is the cool head Jesus had when the Scribes and Pharisees persisted in getting an answer out of him, in harmony with the Law. There was no other answer. If he rushed to her defence, then Jesus would be labelled a sinner himself as he had gone against the Laws of Moses. If he condemned her, then Jesus would have contributed to her stoning and death.

This is where Jesus bought himself time.

He bent down and did some doodling on the ground with his finger. To the observer, he was writing. To the psychologist, he was buying time....to think and to respond...as God his Father would have. Do or say the wrong thing and a self-appointed mob would publicly demand his head. It was all building up to an electrifying confrontation.

But Jesus answered: "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

This answer blindsided the critics. It struck a chord in the hearts and minds of those watching and one by one they walked away. They pulled their heads in. It was not the outcome they wanted. Jesus then released her from the murderous crowd so that she could live...a second time. She was not condemned by Jesus, but forgiven, she now owed him: she owed him the effort to start again and to sin no more.

Forgiveness will always be God's last word for us. We just have to have faith and believe in the loving compassion of God.

NOTIZIE ITALIANE

Domenica 6 Aprile 2025 (Giovanni 8, 1-11)

In quel tempo. Gesù si avviò verso il monte degli Ulivi. Ma al mattino si recò di nuovo nel tempio e tutto il popolo andava da lui. Ed egli sedette e si mise a insegnare loro. Allora gli scribi e i farisei gli condussero una donna sorpresa in adulterio, la posero in mezzo e gli dissero: «Maestro, questa donna è stata sorpresa in flagrante adulterio. Ora Mosè, nella Legge, ci ha comandato di lapidare donne come questa. Tu che ne dici?». Dicevano questo per metterlo alla prova e per avere motivo di accusarlo. Ma Gesù si chinò e si mise a scrivere col dito per terra. Tuttavia, poiché insistevano nell'interrogarlo, si alzò e disse loro: «Chi di voi è senza peccato, getti per primo la pietra contro di lei». E, chinatosi di nuovo, scriveva per terra. Quelli, udito ciò, se ne andarono uno per uno, cominciando dai più anziani. Lo lasciarono solo, e la donna era là in mezzo. Allora Gesù si alzò e le disse: «Donna, dove sono? Néssuno ti ha condannata?». Ed ella rispose: «Nessuno, Signore». E Gesù disse: «Neanch'io ti condanno; và e d'ora in poi non peccare più». Parola del Signore.

«Maestro, questa donna è stata sorpresa in flagrante adulterio. Ora Mosè, nella Legge, ci ha comandato di lapidare donne come questa. Tu che ne dici?». È un'evidente sfida alla sua bontà e alla sua misericordia; forse erano memori della parabola del buon pastore, forse di quella del Padre misericordioso. O, ancora, avevano in mente: "lo non voglio la morte del peccatore, ma che si converta e viva". Gesù ora o contraddirà Mosè, o contraddirà se stesso? Prima di sentire le parole di Gesù e vedere i gesti che egli compie, ascoltiamo Isaia: «Non ricordate più le cose passate, non pensate più alle cose antiche! Ecco, io faccio una cosa nuova: proprio ora germoglia, non ve ne accorgete?». Sta per germogliare dinanzi a giudei falsi e ipocriti, dinanzi a una adultera, la novità di Cristo. La Verità che egli incarna, il perdono che meriterà per noi, l'assoluzione della donna e della Chiesa e dell'intera umanità. Il germoglio, il virgulto nuovo, è la Donna vergine, Maria, casta, santa, senza peccato, nel cui seno è germogliata la vita nuova. Gesù si alzò e le disse: «Donna, nessuno ti ha condannata?». Gesù disse: «Neanch'io ti condanno; và e d'ora in poi non peccare più». Avviene invece la condanna degli accusatori.
