First Reading - Isaiah 66:10-14

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her, all you who love her; rejoice with her in joy, all you who mourn over her— that you may nurse and be satisfied from her consoling breast; that you may drink deeply with delight from her glorious bosom. For thus says the Lord: "I will extend prosperity to her like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing stream; and you shall nurse and be carried on her arm, and dandled on her knees. As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem. "You shall see, and your heart shall rejoice; your bodies shall flourish like the grass; and it shall be known that the hand of the Lord is with his servants.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 66.1-3a, 4-5, 6-7a, 16+20 (R.1)

R. Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

- Make a joyful noise to God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; give to him glorious praise. Say to God, "How awesome are your deeds!" R.
- "All the earth worships you; they sing praises to you, sing praises to your name." Come and see what God has done: he is awesome in his deeds among mortals. R.
- 3. He turned the sea into dry land; they passed through the river on foot. There we rejoiced in him, who rules by his might forever. *R*.
- Come and hear, all you who fear God, and I will tell what he has done for me. Blessed be God, because he has not rejected my prayer or removed his steadfast love from me. *R*.

Second Reading - Galatians 6:14-18

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Galatians.

May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything; but a new creation is everything! As for those who will follow this rule— peace be upon them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God. From now on, let no one make trouble for me; for I carry the marks of Jesus branded on my body. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers and sisters. Amen.

Gospel - Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

The Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. "Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. "Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' "But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.' I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town." The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" Jesus said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. "Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this,that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

GOSPEL REFLECTION Luke 10:1-12,17-20 (14th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C)

The Fall of Satan

In Jewish tradition 'Satan' is the name given to the evil spirit who accuses and prosecutes human beings before God, demanding the strongest penalties, unmitigated by Mercy. Jesus had a vision in which he saw 'Satan fall like lightning from Heaven'. Who takes Satan's place? The answer is the 'Paraclete', a Greek word for an Advocate. This is one of the roles of the Holy Spirit who pleads on our behalf for Mercy which, as Shakespeare put it, then falls on us 'as the gentle rain from Heaven'. As disciples, we have to imitate the Paraclete, not Satan. We have to temper our drive to see 'the punishment fit the crime'. How often do we relish seeing a person squirm with no offer of a way out, no hint of mercy or forgiveness so that he or she can draw breath, undo some of the damage done, and get back on track to a better life? We might pause for a moment to thank God that our names are not being listed by Satan in an indictment but rather, through the Holy Spirit, are being entered in the Book of the Saved so that we might 'Rejoice, for your names are written in Heaven'.

In quel tempo, il Signore designò altri settantadue e li inviò a due a due davanti a sé in ogni città e luogo dove stava per recarsi. Diceva loro: «La messe è abbondante, ma sono pochi gli operai! Pregate dunque il signore della messe, perché mandi operai nella sua messe! Andate: ecco, vi mando come agnelli in mezzo a lupi; non portate borsa, né acca, né sandali e non fermatevi a salutare nessuno lungo la strada. In qualunque casa

entriate, prima dite: "Pace a questa casa!". Se vi sarà un figlio della pace, la vostra pace scenderà su di lui, altrimenti ritornerà su di voi. Restate in quella casa, mangiando e bevendo di quello che hanno, perché chi lavora ha diritto alla sua ricompensa. Non passate da una casa all'altra. Quando entrerete in una città e vi accoglieranno, mangiate quello che vi sarà offerto, guarite i malati che vi si trovano, e dite loro: "È vicino a voi il regno di Dio". Ma quando entrerete in una città e non vi accoglieranno, uscite sulle sue piazze e dite: "Anche la polvere della vostra città, che si è attaccata ai nostri piedi, noi la scuotiamo contro di voi; sappiate però che il regno di Dio è vicino". Parola del Signore.

Questa richiesta di Gesù è sempre valida. Sempre dobbiamo pregare il "padrone della messe", cioè Dio Padre, perché mandi operai a lavorare nel suo campo che è il mondo. E ciascuno di noi lo deve fare con cuore aperto, con un atteggiamento missionario; la nostra preghiera non dev'essere limitata solo ai nostri bisogni, alle nostre necessità: una preghiera è veramente cristiana se ha anche una dimensione universale. Se vissuta in questi termini, la missione della Chiesa sarà caratterizzata dalla gioia. E come finisce questo passo? «I settantadue tornarono pieni di gioia». Non si tratta di una gioia effimera, che scaturisce dal successo della missione; al contrario, è una gioia radicata nella promessa che – dice Gesù – «i vostri nomi sono scritti nei cieli». Con questa espressione Egli intende la gioia interiore, la gioia indistruttibile che nasce dalla consapevolezza di essere chiamati da Dio a seguire il suo Figlio. Cioè la gioia di essere suoi discepoli.
