XVI Ordinary General Assembly of Synod of Bishops Synod on Synodality (30 September- 27 October 2024)

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As Catholics, we are part of a global event that unites us in prayer. Four hundred and sixty-four participants from all corners of the world have gathered in the Vatican for the Second Session of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. The month-long assembly began with a two-day spiritual retreat. Secretary-General of the Synod of Bishops Cardinal Mario Grech opened a two-day retreat on Monday, 30th September, encouraging synod participants and the Catholic faithful to pray the holy rosary for the duration of the Oct. 2–27 global meeting. "I would like to invite everyone, in this month of October devoted to Mother Mary, to pray with the holy rosary during the synod so that this prayer may accompany us on the journey of these days," Grech emphasised that "the rosary is an endless meditation of the word of God."

I invite you to two relevant reflections from the Synod's opening retreat.

Mary: a model of prayer for the Church

The first reflection is on prayer. During the retreat, Grech underscored the supreme importance of prayer, emphasising that the days of retreat are not merely a prelude to the synod but an integral part of it. He highlighted that the synod is inherently a prayerful and liturgical event, with the Holy Spirit being the principal actor. As a token, each participant received rosary beads from the Holy Father and was urged to look to the Blessed Virgin Mary as the "model and image of the Church," to cultivate a Church that listens in a synodal manner. Mary was presented as a prayer model for us in the midst of the intense days of the synodal assembly. Additionally, Mary was described as a synodal figure, demonstrating that the Church is not a product of human effort but rather the work of God (Pope Benedict XVI).

'Breathe deeply' of the Holy Spirit.

The second reflection is from Timothy Radcliffe, who made it clear during the meditation that the synod's challenge is for us to actively support one another in deeply breathing in the rejuvenating Holy Spirit, which brings us to life and renews our spirits in God. Radcliffe urged his listeners to give each other space to breathe—the spiritual oxygen of the Holy Spirit. He emphasized that despite our differences and disagreements, our peace in Christ remains unshaken. Reflecting on the Gospel accounts of the Resurrection, Radcliffe confidently highlighted that the disciples, empowered by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, partake in Jesus' resurrected life and are commissioned to spread the message. He stressed that the synodal Church's mission calls for us to emulate St. Mary Magdalene, the beloved disciple, St. John, and St. Peter, as 'seekers' of the risen Lord. We, too, must be present for the 'seekers' of our time, and we can only effectively preach the Resurrection if we are truly alive in God.

In the coming days, let's come together as a parish community and our families in prayer and open our hearts to the guidance of the Holy Spirit during the Synodal Assembly.

NEW STAFF CAR PARK FOR ST. AUGUSTINE'S PARISH SCHOOL

Dear Parishioners,

Many of you have already noticed the beautiful carpark being constructed on one side of the Pioneer Cemetery on Ponton Street. Back in June of 2022, St. Augustine's Parish School approached me regarding the viability of using a small portion of the land at the end of Pioneer Cemetery to build a car park for school staff to use. The reasons for this request included that the school's enrolment is at an all-time high, and the school required more parking, especially in the context of the Master Plan aimed at expanding the school. We currently have a shared parking space, which is insufficient for school and parish needs.

This proposal for the new carpark was subsequently discussed with the Parish Admin and Finance Committee, and Parish Pastoral Council in their meetings, and after considerable deliberation, was approved, subject to the approval of the Diocesan Property Office and the Archbishop. In making that decision, the Parish Admin and Finance Committee considered many issues, including the following:

- The safety aspects of children, staff and parishioners. The crowded Church car park makes it more challenging to manage the peak-hour traffic, causing danger to everyone, especially on school days.
- The vehicles parked on the side of Commercial Road obstruct the drivers' view, making it difficult to drive out of St. Augustine's Church onto Commercial Road. This problem will be lessened when the school staff has a separate car park.
- The separate car park for the school, primarily used by school staff, will ease the congestion in the current car park during the day, especially on weekdays and when we have to manage large funerals or other parish activities.
- The Parish will be allowed to use the new car park, especially during the high Church attendance occasions, including but not limited to Christmas and Easter.
- The school will cover all costs related to building and maintaining the car park and installing cameras for safety.
- The school is making a monthly contribution (rent) to the Parish to use this parish land as a car park, which will help the Parish financially.
- Our Cemetery Curator, Paul Hawkes, who is a member of the Admin and Finance Committee, calculated the land needed for the Cemetery's future expansion, considering all related aspects, and made financial projections regarding the financial viability of the car park proposal. As a result of these projections, it was determined that the Parish would not lose any money from this arrangement compared to the financial benefit of retaining this proposed plot of land for cemetery purposes.

On behalf of the Parish, the Diocesan Property Office considered the proposal and, subject to the development and signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Catholic Education Office, St. Augustine's Parish School and the Parish, gave approval for the use of the land for this purpose.

Hence, with the endorsement of the Archdiocese the Parish Admin and Finance Committee unanimously approved the project for a car park for school staff. The Salisbury Council's permission was subsequently obtained, and the car park is now nearing completion and will be in use towards the end of October. The Admin and Finance Committee have determined that the remaining land will be used to expand the Cemetery, which, according to our Catholic understanding (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 2447), is a work of mercy.

I would like to thank everyone who was involved in implementing this important project, which meets school and parish needs for extra parking and helps address our shared safety concerns. I also thank the members of the Parish Admin and Finance Committee, Parish Pastoral Council, Diocesan Property Management, Catholic Education Office, Nicholas Dangcalan (our Parish Business Manager), Paul Hawkes (our Cemetery Curator), the Cemetery Committee, Anne Blake (the previous Business Manager), Sue Knight (Chair, Parish Pastoral Council), Perry Peremiczko (Chair, Parish Admin & Finance Council), Dan Cowan and the St. Augustine's school leadership, for implementing an effective and collaborative process.
