Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - Year A

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8.2-3, 14-16

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

God fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know. Moses spoke to the people: "Remember the long way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, in order to humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commandments. He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted, in order to make you understand that one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord. "Do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good."

Gospel: John 6.51-59

✠A reading from the holy gospel according to John.

Jesus said to the crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." The people then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So, Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. "Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever." Jesus said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum.

GOSPEL REFLECTION - THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

The Maternal Jesus

I once saw a young mother discreetly breastfeeding her baby during Mass, and thought ... 'What a wonderful thing!' There could not be a better illustration, a better acting out of what Jesus says in today's Gospel: 'The one who eats me will live.' Of course, even mothers who find they cannot breastfeed offer the same gift for nine months as the baby draws its life from the mother's body in the womb. This is a good analogy for what Our Lord was teaching in today's Gospel. 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me and I in them.' Notice the very maternal language. The risen Lord truly abides in us, we truly abide in the risen Lord. This is as intimate as the baby dwelling in the womb of its mother. Moreover, it is a Holy communion which is both a present reality and a foretaste and promise about our place in God's future: 'The one who eats this bread will live forever.' We could pause for a moment to pray with St Thomas Aquinas: 'Oh Sacred Banquet in which Christ is received *and* a pledge of future glory is given to us.'

Domenica 7 Giugno 2026

Corpus Domini - Anno A - Giovanni 6, 51-58 (estratto)

«Io sono il pane vivo, disceso dal cielo. Se uno mangia di questo pane vivrà in eterno e il pane che io darò è la mia carne per la vita del mondo». Allora i Giudei si misero a discutere aspramente fra loro: «Come può costui darci la sua carne da mangiare?». Gesù disse loro: «In verità, in verità io vi dico: se non mangiate la carne del Figlio dell'uomo e non bevete il suo sangue, non avete in voi la vita. Chi mangia la mia carne e beve il mio sangue ha la vita eterna e io lo risusciterò nell'ultimo giorno. Perché la mia carne è vero cibo e il mio sangue vera bevanda. Chi mangia la mia carne e beve il mio sangue rimane in me e io in lui. Come il Padre, che ha la vita, ha mandato me e io vivo per il Padre, così anche colui che mangia me vivrà per me. Questo è il pane disceso dal cielo; non è come quello che mangiarono i padri e morirono. Chi mangia questo pane vivrà in eterno». **Parola del Signore.**

Cristo è la risposta di Dio alla fame dell'uomo, perché il suo corpo è il pane della vita eterna: prendete e mangiatene tutti! L'invito di Gesù abbraccia la nostra esperienza quotidiana: per vivere, abbiamo bisogno di nutrirci della vita, togliendola a piante e animali. Eppure, mangiare qualcosa di morto ci ricorda che anche noi, per quanto mangiamo, moriremo. Quando invece ci nutriamo di Gesù, pane vivo e vero, viviamo per Lui. Offrendo tutto sé stesso, il Crocifisso Risorto si consegna a noi, che scopriamo così d'essere fatti per nutrirci di Dio. Come scrive Sant'Agostino, davvero Cristo è un pane che nutre e non viene meno; un pane che si può mangiare ma non si può esaurire. L'Eucaristia, infatti, è la presenza vera, reale e sostanziale del Salvatore, che trasforma il pane in sé, per trasformare noi in Lui. Vivo e vivificante, il Corpus Domini rende noi, cioè la Chiesa stessa, corpo del Signore.
