Solemnity of Pentecost Sunday - Year C

First Reading – Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because all heard them speaking in their own languages. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and converts, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

Second Reading – Romans 8.8-17

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him.

But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of God who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh – for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

GOSPEL REFLECTION John 14.15-16, 23b-26 (Pentecost Sunday – Year C)

In the very old days, the 'Holy Spirit' was known as the 'Holy Ghost'. It may come from the old English word 'gust' which 'blows wherever it pleases'. St Luke's account of Pentecost tells of what 'sounded like a powerful wind from heaven'. This is the Divine Wind, this is the Holy Gust, the Holy Spirit. Out of nowhere, this mighty Gust burst into the disciples' lives with gale force, sweeping away their fear.

The Divine Wind is nothing less than the Breath of God. 'O Breathe on me Breath of God' is one of the most beautiful hymns, sung to a traditional Irish melody. One verse goes: 'O Breathe on me Breath of God . . . until this earthly part of me glows with thy fire divine'. It is like a log at the back of the fireplace late at night. The log is intact but absolutely glowing through and through with fire. It is to be the same with us.

Peter was inspired to preach to the crowds 'with a loud voice' about 'Jesus the Nazarene' and the fact that 'God raised him to life'. That is the gospel. That is the message which those who breathe with the breath of God have been preaching since the birthday of the Church at Pentecost.

We could pause for a moment to pray an ancient chant of the Church:

'Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of your love.
Send forth your Spirit and they will be created, and you will renew the face of the earth.'

From June 20-22, Salisbury Parish will host the exhibit of a first-class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis in the Family Centre, 23 Commercial Road, Salisbury. Blessed Carlo can be considered the first millennial saint and will be canonised at a later date, by our new Pope Leo XIV. The relic exhibition will be on display in the Family Centre until 5.30pm each day. There will be a Mass in St Augustine's Church at 9.30am both on Friday, June 20, and on Saturday, June 21, followed by adoration, and confession on request. On Sunday, June 22, after the 9:00am Mass, parishioners will still have the opportunity to view the exhibition and venerate the relic until 5.30 pm.

This is part of a Vatican International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles which Blessed Carlo put together between the ages of 11 and 15.

Domenica 8 Giugno 2025 – Pentecoste - (Giovanni 14, 15-16, 23-26)

"Lo Spirito Santo vi insegnerà ogni cosa" In quel tempo, Gesù disse ai suoi discepoli: «Se mi amate, osserverete i miei comandamenti; e io pregherò il Padre ed egli vi darà un altro Paraclito perché rimanga con voi per sempre. Se uno mi ama, osserverà la mia parola e il Padre mio lo amerà e noi verremo a lui e prenderemo dimora presso di lui. Chi non mi ama, non osserva le mie parole; e la parola che voi ascoltate non è mia, ma del Padre che mi ha mandato. Vi ho detto queste cose mentre sono ancora presso di voi. Ma il Paraclito, lo Spirito Santo che il Padre manderà nel mio nome, lui vi insegnerà ogni cosa e vi ricorderà tutto ciò che io vi ho detto».

Parola del Signore.

Veni, Sancte Spiritus! Un'invocazione tanto semplice e immediata, ma insieme straordinariamente profonda, sgorgata prima di tutto dal cuore di Cristo. Lo Spirito Santo, infatti, è il dono che Gesù ha chiesto e continuamente chiede al Padre per i suoi amici; il primo e principale dono che ci ha ottenuto con la sua Risurrezione e Ascensione al Cielo. Questa preghiera raggiunge il suo vertice e il suo compimento sulla croce, dove l'invocazione di Cristo fa tutt'uno con il dono totale che Egli fa di se stesso, e così il suo pregare diventa per così dire il sigillo stesso del suo donarsi in pienezza per amore del Padre e dell'umanità: invocazione e donazione della Spirito s'incontrano, si compenetrano, diventano un'unica realtà. «E io pregherò il Padre ed egli vi darà un altro Paraclito perché rimanga con voi per sempre». In realtà, la preghiera di Gesù - quella dell'Ultima Cena e quella sulla croce - è una preghiera che permane anche in Cielo, dove Cristo siede alla destra del Padre. Gesù, infatti, vive sempre il suo sacerdozio d'intercessione a favore del popolo di Dio e dell'umanità e quindi prega per tutti noi chiedendo al Padre il dono dello Spirito Santo. A Pentecoste lo Spirito Santo si manifesta come fuoco. La sua fiamma è discesa sui discepoli riuniti, si è accesa in essi e ha donato loro il nuovo ardore di Dio. Com'è diverso questo fuoco da quello delle guerre e delle bombe! Com'è diverso l'incendio di Cristo, propagato dalla Chiesa, rispetto a quelli accesi dai dittatori di ogni epoca, anche del secolo scorso, che lasciano dietro di se terra bruciata.
