'Good Shepherd Sunday'

~World Day of Prayer for Vocations~

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said: I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

#### Second Reading Revelation 7:9,14-17 A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'




# ELECTION OF OUR NEW POPE - HIS HOLINESS POPE LEO XIV

On Thursday, 8<sup>th</sup> May, Pope Leo XIV emerged from the Balcony of St Peter's Basilica signifying the beginning of a new Papacy with the words "Peace be with you." The new Pope, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost OSA is an American Cardinal of the Catholic Church, born on 14th September, 1955 in Chicago, Illinois. He is a member of the Order of Saint Augustine (OSA), and was ordained a Priest in 1982. Pope Leo XIV has a background in canon law and has served in various international roles, including as a Missionary and Bishop in Peru, where he was appointed Bishop of Chiclayo in 2015. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops, placing him in charge of overseeing the selection of Bishops worldwide. He was made a Cardinal on 30th September, 2023.

## We take this opportunity to pray for our new Pope Leo XIV and for the Universal Church.

O God, shepherd and ruler of all the faithful, look favorably on your servant Pope Leo XIV, whom you have set at the head of your Church as her shepherd; grant, we pray, that by word and example he may be of service to those over whom he presides so that, together with the flock entrusted to his care, he may come to everlasting life. 

## **NOTIZIE ITALIANE** Domenica 11 Maggio 2025 (Giovanni 10, 1-10)

In quel temp, Gesù disse: "In verità, in verità io vi dico: Chi non entra nel recinto delle pecore dalla porta, ma vi sale da un'altra parte, è un ladro e un brigante. Chi invece entra dalla porta, è pastore delle pecore. Il guardiano gli apre e le pecore ascoltano la sua voce: egli chiama le sue pecore, ciascuna per nome, e le conduce fuori. E quando ha spinto fuori tutte le sue pecore, cammina davanti ad esse, e le pecore lo seguono perché conoscono la sua voce. Un estraneo invece non lo seguiranno, ma guggiranno via da lui, perché non conoscono la voce degli estranei". lo sono la porta: se uno entra attraverso me, sarà salvato; entrerà e uscirà e troverà pascolo. Il ladro non viene se non per rubare, uccidere e distruggere; io sono venuto perché abbiano la vita e l'abbiano in abbondanza". Parola del Signore.

Gesù, prima di designarsi come Pastore, dice con nostra sorpresa: "lo sono la porta". È attraverso di Lui che si deve entrare nel servizio di pastore. Gesù mette in risalto molto chiaramente questa condizione di fondo affermando: "Chi sale da un'altra parte, è un ladro e un brigante". Questa parola "sale" evoca l'immagine di gualcuno che si arrampica sul recinto per giungere, scavalcando, là dove legittimamente non potrebbe arrivare. "Salire", si può qui vedere anche l'immagine del carrierismo, del tentativo di arrivare "in alto", di procurarsi una posizione mediante la Chiesa: servirsi, non servire. È l'immagine dell'uomo che, attraverso il sacerdozio, vuole farsi importante, diventare un personaggio; l'immagine di colui che ha di mira la propria esaltazione e non l'umile servizio di Gesù Cristo. Ma l'unica ascesa legittima verso il ministero del pastore è la croce. È guesta la vera ascesa, è guesta la vera porta. Non desiderare di diventare personalmente qualcuno, ma invece esserci per l'altro, per Cristo, e così mediante Lui e con Lui esserci per gli uomini che Egli cerca, che Egli vuole condurre sulla via della vita. Si entra nel sacerdozio attraverso il Sacramento, e ciò significa appunto: attraverso la donazione di se stessi a Cristo, affinché Egli disponga di me; affinché io Lo serva e segua la sua chiamata, anche se questa dovesse essere in contrasto con i miei desideri di autorealizzazione e stima. Entrare per la porta, che è Cristo, vuol dire conoscerlo ed amarlo sempre di più, perché la nostra volontà si unisca alla sua e il nostro agire diventi una cosa sola col suo agire. Per guesta intenzione vogliamo pregare sempre di nuovo, vogliamo impegnarci proprio per questo, che cioè Cristo cresca in noi, che la nostra unione con Lui diventi sempre più profonda, cosicché per il nostro tramite sia Cristo stesso Colui che pasce.
