#### First Reading – Deuteronomy 30.10-14

#### A reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

Moses spoke to the people, saying, "Obey the Lord your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law; turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul. "Surely this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' "Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' "No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe."

#### <u>Responsorial Psalm</u> – Psalm 69.13+16, 29-30, 32-33, 35ab+36 (R.32)

#### R. Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.

As for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love, answer me. With your steadfast help, rescue me. Answer me, O Lord, for your steadfast love is good; according to your abundant mercy, turn to me. **R**.

But I am lowly and in pain; let your salvation, O God, protect me. I will praise the name of God with a song; I will magnify him with thanksgiving.

Let the oppressed see it and be glad; you who seek God, let your hearts revive. For the Lord hears the needy, and does not despise his own that are in bonds. *R*.

For God will save Zion and rebuild the cities of Judah; the children of his servants shall inherit it, those who love his name shall live in it. **R**.

#### Second Reading - Colossians 1.15-20

#### A reading from the letter of Paul to the Colossians.

Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers— all things have been created through him and for him. Christ is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in Christ all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

#### Gospel - Luke 10:25-37

#### A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

"Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" The lawyer answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself." And Jesus said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." But wanting to justify himself, the lawyer asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. "But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. "The next day the Samaritan took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.'" Jesus asked, "Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" The lawyer said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

#### GOSPEL REFLECTION Luke 10:25-37 (15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C) The Neighbourliness of Global Citizens

The lawyer asked a self-serving question: 'Who is my neighbour?' He could then set the limits, the boundaries of those close enough to merit his concern. Jesus replies with a story to show that the better question is: 'To whom should I be neighbourly?' The answer is: To any person who is wounded in any way – physically, psychologically, socially, economically. And we have to do so overcoming the labelling, even bigotry, which can conveniently put a person outside the range of our concern. When we act like the Samaritan, we deserve the title 'Catholic' which means universal. Pope Francis said that Christ is constantly inviting us, as he invited Thomas, to touch His wounds which are to be found in the wounded of our own time. We could pause for a moment to thank God that we live in an age of technology which can enable us to be truly Catholic global citizens practising Mercy Without Borders. 'Do this and you will live.'

# NOTIZIE ITALIANE

**Domenica 13 Luglio 2025 - 15 C - (Luca 10, 25-37.)** (Source: Pope Benedict XVI - Angelus, 11 July 2010)

«Maestro, che cosa devo fare per ereditare la vita eterna?». Gesù gli disse: «Che cosa sta scritto nella Legge? Come leggi?». Costui rispose: «Amerai il Signore tuo Dio con tutto il tuo cuore, con tutta la tua anima, con tutta la tua forza e con tutta la tua mente, e il tuo prossimo come te stesso». Gli disse: «Hai risposto bene; fà questo e vivrai». Ma quello, volendo giustificarsi, disse a Gesù: «E chi è mio prossimo?». Gesù riprese: «Un uomo scendeva da Gerusalemme a Gèrico e cadde nelle mani dei briganti, che gli portarono via tutto, lo percossero a sangue e se ne andarono, lasciandolo mezzo morto. Per caso, un sacerdote scendeva per quella medesima strada e, quando lo vide, passò oltre. Anche un levita, giunto in quel luogo, vide e passò oltre. Invece un Samaritano, che era in viaggio, passandogli accanto, vide e ne ebbe compassione. Gli si fece vicino, gli fasciò le ferite, versandovi olio e vino; poi lo caricò sulla sua cavalcatura, lo portò in un albergo e si prese cura di lui. Il giorno seguente, tirò fuori due denari e li diede all'albergatore, dicendo: "Abbi cura di lui; ciò che spenderai in più, te lo pagherò al mio ritorno". Chi di questi tre ti sembra sia stato prossimo di colui che è caduto nelle mani dei briganti?». Quello rispose: «Chi ha avuto compassione di lui». Gesù gli disse: «Và e anche tu fà così». Parola del Signore.

Il Vangelo di questa domenica si apre con la domanda che un dottore della Legge pone a Gesù: «Maestro, che cosa devo fare per ereditare la vita eterna?». Sapendolo esperto nelle Sacre Scritture, il Signore invita quell'uomo a dare lui stesso la risposta, che infatti egli formula perfettamente, citando i due comandamenti principali: amare Dio con tutto il cuore, tutta la mente e tutte le forze, e amare il prossimo come se stessi. Allora il dottore della Legge, quasi per giustificarsi, chiede: "E chi è mio prossimo?". Questa volta, Gesù risponde con la celebre parabola del "buon Samaritano", per indicare che sta a noi farci "prossimo" di chiunque abbia bisogno di aiuto. Questo racconto evangelico offre il "criterio di misura", cioè "l'universalità dell'amore che si volge verso il bisognoso incontrato «per caso», chiunque egli sia". Accanto a questa regola universale, vi è anche un'esigenza specificamente ecclesiale: che "nella Chiesa stessa, in quanto famiglia, nessun membro soffra perché nel bisogno". Il programma del cristiano, appreso dall'insegnamento di Gesù, è "un cuore che vede" dove c'è bisogno di amore, e agisce in modo conseguente.
