UNDERSTANDING OF 'LAST RITES'

Do you know about the "Last Rites"?

What many Catholics do not understand is that the "last rites" encompass several Sacraments, including Penance (confession of sins), Viaticum (Holy Communion given as food for the journey to eternal life) and the Anointing of the Sick. Ideally, those Sacraments should be administered when the recipient is aware and able to benefit most. So, if a family member is very sick and perhaps close to death, please call the priest while they are still able to receive all three Sacraments. Do not deny these Sacraments to your family members by waiting until they are unconscious or unable to consume Holy Communion.

What if my family member has died?

Like all the Sacraments, Anointing is given only to the living. The word "Sacrament" means "sign" a sign of Christ's presence, but after death, the person is already meeting Christ face to face. (If there is doubt about whether death has occurred, the Sacrament of Anointing may still be administered.) If the person has already died, the priest instead chooses from the prayers for the deceased in his ritual book (Pastoral Care of the Sick).

When should I call for the priest to administer the "Last Rites"?

What is particularly troublesome to parish priests is that families often wait until the last minute before calling a priest. Some even say, "We do not want to scare the sick person!" So, call the priest while the sick person can choose to receive the sacraments. Of course, there will be emergencies when this is not possible, and sometimes only the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick can be administered. Sometimes, the onset of dementia means that only the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick can be administered.

Does someone have to be dying to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

The clear teaching of the church is that someone does not have to be in extremis (i.e. in imminent danger of dying). Canon No. 1004 provides that "the anointing of the sick can be administered to a member of the faithful who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". The ritual itself designates as proper recipients, "a sick person before surgery, whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness" as well as "elderly people if they are weak, though not dangerously ill". What many forget is that the first purpose of anointing is to bring about healing, physically and spiritually. In his epistle, St. James (Jas 5:14-15) says: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person". If, instead, it be the will of God that the person will soon die, the prayer of anointing asks that the person be relieved of suffering and feel the power and peace of God. The Sacrament should be administered when it can do the most good, so the rule of thumb is: Call the priest sooner rather than later.

Our Sacraments

Our Seven Sacraments are wonderful encounters with our loving God. And the Sacraments of Penance, Eucharist, and Anointing of the Sick are of special benefit to those who are sick.

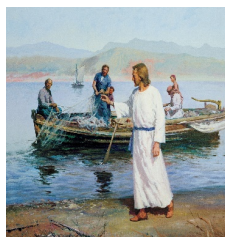

28ª Domenica - Anno B (Marco 10, 17-30)

Gesù fissando su di lui lo sguardo, lo amò". E' un dettaglio di toccante tenerezza. La forza di quello sguardo e la carica di quell'amore spingono ad accogliere quanto lo Spirito ci può suggerire. Ma all'invito a lasciare tutto, si rattristò e "se ne andò". Per quel "tale" le ricchezze hanno conteso più di quello sguardo di amorevolezza. Per lui, la sicurezza offerta da quello che possedeva, "aveva molti beni", era un vantaggio a cui non avrebbe rinunciato per nessuna cosa al mondo. Neanche per seguire Gesù. Ecco perché le ricchezze possono essere pericolose. Ecco perché Gesù lancia quel famoso detto: "E' più facile che un cammello passi per la cruna di un ago, che un ricco entri nel regno di Dio".
