PILGRIMS OF HOPE

This is our Jubilee Year, celebrate to honour the birth of Jesus Christ. Our Pope has asked us for special attention in this year to be "Pilgrims of Hope".

We know that the great virtue of Hope sits in the middle of the trio of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Yet in some ways it is the most difficult to define. Hope always looks to a future, a future that in some way will be better than our present. But Hope is lived now, and is not simply waiting for a future that is to come.

St Paul, in his letters to the early followers of Jesus Christ, has many things to say about the future. Paul especially wants his readers to be ready for the coming of Christ – at an unknown time in the future. Yet Paul also wants us to live now in anticipation of that future.

To the Christians at Thessalonika, Paul writes:

"You can remember how we treated every one of you as a father treats his children, teaching you whata was right, encouraging you and appealing to you to live a life worthy of God, who is calling you to share the glory of his kingdom." (1Th 2:11-12)

And to Titus, Paul has a similar message:

"We must be self-restrained and live good and religious lives here in this Present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of the great God and saviour Christ Jesus" (Tit 2:12-23)

When she was a young woman, Jan Ruff-O'Herne was conscripted as a slave by the Japanese occupation forces in her home in Java. Just before the worst treatment was meted out to her, she was able to open her Bible at random. It opened at the letter to the Romans, and Jan read:

"Let us find strength with the Lord. What we suffer in this life can never be compared with the glory which is waiting for us. We must share his sufferings if we are to share his glory. Nothing therefore can come between us and the love of Christ, even if we are troubled, or worried or being persecuted or hungry or naked, or being threatened by the sword or even attacked." (Jan Ruff-O'Herne: Fifty Years of Silence, p89)

For Jan, that wonderful future in Christ sustained her in the "now" of her humiliation and deep suffering.

As Pilgrims of Hope, we journey step by step to our goal in Christ. We hope in the future that awaits us with Christ. But we are also sustained by that Hope right now, as we take each step on our pilgrim journey. Fill your days with beautiful Hope, and live!

Volunteer Teacher of English for Refugees and Asylum Seekers Vinnies Refugee and Asylum Seeker Service (Kilburn) is seeking a volunteer to teach basic and functional English to refugees and asylum seekers. Classes are held at the Kilburn Community Centre on Wednesday and Thursday mornings from 9.30am to 12.15pm. Class dates follow the school term. Qualifications are not essential, but some experience is necessary. There is volunteer support for the teacher at the classes. The group is composed mainly of older persons who have not been to school, male and female, from mixed countries of origin and all are refugees. Their English level is low. HOMESHARE:

A solution to the rental crisis for older women in SA

Homelessness among older women in Australia is increasing, making them one of the fastest-growing groups at risk of housing insecurity. The Homeshare program offers an innovative solution that fosters shared living based on mutual support and reciprocity—a model that has been successfully running around the world for years. A partnership between St Vincent de Paul Society SA, Westside Housing and Shelter SA, the Homeshare Pilot Program is a fee free service that carefully matches female householders aged 55+ living on their own that have a spare bedroom, with female homesharers that need affordable accommodation from a similar age group that can offer some help around the house. Unlike a traditional flatmate arrangement, the matching process is rigorous: both parties undergo interviews, reference checks and police clearances to ensure a safe and reliable match. 
