First Reading Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; the first heaven and the first earth had disappeared now, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the holy city, and the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, as beautiful as a bride all dressed for her husband. Then I heard a loud voice call from the throne, 'You see this city? Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them. He will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone.' Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION

5th Sunday of Easter – Year C

Is love the first word your family members use to describe their interactions? Love is difficult. Jesus' sacrifice for us is an example of this. Yet because of love, the glory of God is fully revealed in Jesus. God's glory is revealed in us when we act as the Body of Christ, as individuals and as a community. In the love we have for one another—difficult, challenging, sacrificial love—we find Jesus.

Choose one or two occasions when your family was together during the week. Describe the family's interactions from an outsider's perspective. When is it less difficult to show love to family members? When is it more difficult? When love is difficult, what do we do?

Jesus didn't just tell us to love one another. He showed us how to love one another. In what ways did Jesus show us how to love? Domenica 18 Maggio 2025 (Giovanni 13, 31-35.)

"Vi do un comandamento nuovo: che vi amiate gli uni gli altri Quando Giuda fu uscito [dal cenacolo], Gesù disse: "Ora il Figlio dell'uomo è stato glorificato, e Dio è stato glorificato in lui. Se Dio è stato glorificato in lui, anche Dio lo glorificherà da parte sua e lo glorificherà subito. Figlioli, ancora per poco sono con voi. Vi do un comandamento nuovo: che vi amiate gli uni gli altri. Come io ho amato voi, così amatevi anche voi gli uni gli altri. Da questo tutti sapranno che siete miei discepoli: se avete amore gli uni per gli altri". Parola del Signore. Nel mistero pasquale, passione e glorificazione sono strettamente legate fra loro, formano un'unità inscindibile. Gesù afferma: "Ora il Figlio dell'uomo è stato glorificato, e Dio è stato glorificato in lui" e lo fa quando Giuda esce dal Cenacolo per attuare il piano del suo tradimento, che condurrà alla morte del Maestro: proprio in quel momento inizia la glorificazione di Gesù. L'evangelista Giovanni lo fa comprendere chiaramente: non dice, infatti, che Gesù è stato glorificato solo dopo la sua passione, per mezzo della risurrezione, ma mostra che la sua glorificazione è iniziata proprio con la passione. In essa Gesù manifesta la sua gloria, che è gloria dell'amore, che dona tutto se stesso. Egli ha amato il Padre, compiendo la sua volontà fino in fondo, con una donazione perfetta; ha amato l'umanità dando la sua vita per noi. Così già nella sua passione viene glorificato, e Dio viene glorificato in lui. Ma la passione, come espressione realissima e profonda del suo amore, è soltanto un inizio. Per questo Gesù afferma che la sua glorificazione sarà anche futura. Poi il Signore, nel momento in cui annuncia la sua partenza da questo mondo, quasi come testamento ai suoi discepoli per continuare in modo nuovo la sua presenza in mezzo a loro, dà ad essi un comandamento: "Vi do un comandamento nuovo: che vi amiate gli uni gli altri. Come io ho amato voi, così amatevi gli uni gli altri». Se ci amiamo gli uni gli altri, Gesù continua ad essere presente in mezzo a noi, ad essere glorificato nel mondo. Gesù parla di un comandamento nuovo". Ma qual'è la sua novità? Già nell'Antico Testamento Dio aveva dato il comando dell'amore; ora, penò, questo comandamento è diventato nuovo in quanto Gesù vi apporta un'aggiunta molto importante: "Come io ho amato voi, così amatevi gli uni gli altri". Ciò che è nuovo è proprio questo "amare come Gesù ha amato".
