First Reading - Exodus 17.8-13

A reading from the book of Exodus.

Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, "Choose some men for us and go out, fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill. Whenever Moses held up his hands, Israel prevailed; and whenever he lowered his hands, Amalek prevailed. But Moses' hands grew weary; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; so his hands were steady until the sun set. And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 121.1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8 (R.2)

R. Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

I lift up my eyes to the hills— from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. **R.**

The Lord will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber.

He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep. R.

The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand.

The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night. R.

The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life.

The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore. R.

Second Reading - 2 Timothy 3.14 - 4.2

A reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy.

Continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching.

Gospel - Luke 18.1-8

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

Jesus told the disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, 'Grant me justice against my opponent.' "For a while the judge refused; but later he said to himself, 'Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming.'" And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. Will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, God will quickly grant justice to them. "And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

GOSPEL REFLECTION - Luke 18:1-8

The judge in this story only gives in to the distraught widow when she threatens 'to give him a black eye' (in the Greek)! Jesus is not saying God is like the judge who needs to be battered into submission. Jesus is saying we need to pray like that widow. Think of what widows in Syria or Iraq are praying for tonight. Then think of one's own prayer. God is not the slightest bit interested in my usual trivial, self-promoting prayers. But He is interested in my being such a woeful prayer and wants to change me. Recall an incident of really urgent, intense prayer. Most likely, it was to do with a traumatic accident or fatal disease of a baby, of a spouse, of a parent too young. Apply that intense urgency to those in the world crying out: 'give us this day our daily bread'. In short, pray The Lord's Prayer with meaning. We could pause for a moment to pray to live out the consequences of the 'Our Father' lest we are threatened with a black eve! © Fr Michael Tate: mtate@biapond.com



BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE




In remembrance of all our deceased parishioners and loved ones who passed away,

«Il Figlio dell'uomo, quando verrà, troverà la fede sulla terra?». Come a dire: quando verrò alla fine della storia ma, possiamo pensare, anche ora, in questo momento della vita troverò un po' fede in voi, nel vostro mondo? È una domanda seria. Immaginiamo che il Signore venga oggi sulla terra: vedrebbe, purtroppo, tante guerre, tanta povertà, tante disuguaglianze, e al tempo stesso grandi conquiste della tecnica, mezzi moderni e gente che va sempre di corsa, senza fermarsi mai; ma troverebbe chi gli dedica tempo e affetto, chi lo mette al primo posto? E soprattutto chiediamoci: che cosa troverebbe in me, se il Signore oggi venisse, che cosa troverebbe in me, nella mia vita, nel mio cuore? Quali priorità della mia vita vedrebbe? Noi, spesso, ci concentriamo su tante cose urgenti ma non necessarie, ci occupiamo e ci preoccupiamo di molte realtà secondarie; e magari, senza accorgerci, trascuriamo quello che più conta e lasciamo che il nostro amore per Dio si vada raffreddando, si raffreddi poco a poco. Oggi Gesù ci offre il rimedio per riscaldare una fede intiepidita. E qual è il rimedio? La preghiera. La preghiera è la medicina della fede, il ricostituente dell'anima. Bisogna, però, che sia una preghiera costante.
