LET US GET CONNECTED... (John 10/11-18)

My dear parishioners and friends,

There is an ancient legend about two mountain tribes. One lived at the foot of the mountains in the lowlands, and the other lived at the mountain's top. These two tribes were enemies and constantly at war with one another. One day, the tribe from the top of the mountain attacked the lowlander's village. During their loot, they kidnapped a young boy and took him with them back up the mountain. The lowlanders immediately responded by selecting fifty of their most robust and capable warriors and sending them to rescue the boy. The problem was that the lowlanders did not know how to climb mountains. They did not know the paths that should be used. So, these fifty soldiers tried path after path and climbing method after climbing method. All to no avail. After three or four days of futile efforts, hopeless and helpless, they decided to give up and return to their village. But as they were packing their gear, they looked up and they saw the mother of the child who had been kidnapped coming down from the mountain that they were unable to climb. She had her son strapped to her back. One of the soldiers went up to greet her and said, "You succeeded where fifty of the most capable people of our village, failed. How is this possible?" The woman shrugged and said, "He was not your child."

Whenever we give life to another person, we are connected to that person forever. For the giving of life forms a bond that time does not break. Mothers know this because they give life to one another in the most fundamental sense. But everyone connected to anyone knows this as well because if we are connected deeply to anyone, that connection leads to life-giving actions. If we are connected to others, we feel their pain. When others we are connected with make bad decisions or are in danger, we suffer with them-two attacks in three days in Sydney last week. Like almost everyone, I stopped what I was doing and sat glued to the television as the surreal events unfolded before my eves. In both occurrences, the attackers had different motives. But in both cases, the innocent people were affected. The dreams of a lovely weekend or the peace of a worship place were replaced by absolute horror and chaos. I find it hard to believe. We are all hurt. But I realised that in this sadness. God is closer to us than any other situation I've ever known. In subsequent days, the Television news communicated a strange irony: amidst this absolute catastrophe of unspeakable proportions, there is a beauty in how human beings act that defines the imagination. TV Channels showed us that everyone-underscore, everyone-is everyone else's brother or sister. People supported each other, prayed for the affected, and organised help and reflection days. Tears ran freely; affection was exchanged openly.

God is the one who gave us life, and so God is bound to us by bonds that cannot be broken. Just as the Good Shepherd cares for the sheep and is willing to lay down his life for the sheep, God cares for us and is willing to do all necessary to help us. We are learning from our Master. Let us realise that all are our brothers and sisters, and we must continue supporting everyone. Let us get into life-giving actions so that there may never be another occurrence of violence or intolerance. Let us bind wounds, comfort the grieving, and make God present.
