SECOND SESSION OF SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

02-27 October 2024

In March 2020, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023 would be "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission". The journey towards the celebration of the Synod opened in October 2021 in dioceses around the world. Pope Francis invited the entire Church to reflect on this theme, which is decisive for its life and mission. Holy Father then extended the Synod to a second session leading to October 2024. The Synod's General Secretariat released the *Instrumentum Laboris* for the Second Session of the Synod on 9 July 2024. The *Instrumentum Laboris* is intended to be a working tool to encourage prayer, dialogue, discernment, and the maturing of a consensus, which will lead to a final document being delivered to the Holy Father following the Second Session. The document is comprised of five parts:

- Introduction
- Foundations include an understanding of synodality as sanctioned by the First Session.
- Relations – which looks at the missionary synodal life of the Church from the perspective of relationships with the Lord, between brothers and sisters, and between Churches.
- Pathways – which focuses on the paths which support and nourish the dynamism of relationships; and,
- Places – which speak of the concreteness of the contexts in which relationships are embodied.

The Second Assembly is due from 2 to 27 October 2024. A spiritual retreat for members will be held from 30 September to 1 October. Leading up to the synod on synodality, numerous articles and social media posts have raised many concerns about the synod.

Dr. Richard Declue, a catholic systematic theology professor, writing on Synod on Synodality, **Preparing Ourselves for the Synod** (Word on Fire, October 3, 2023), makes the following suggestions to the Catholic faithful around the globe.

"My first recommendation is to have faith, not in the machinations of sinful men, but in the protection of the Holy Spirit, who guides the Church into all truth (see John 16:13). I suspect that we will read things about and from the Synod that will disturb us, as we already have. In the midst of this, do not slip into despair but rather persevere in faith, trusting in Our Lord.

My second recommendation is this: with hope, pray for members of the Synod and the Holy Father, Pope Francis. And might I ask that your prayer take the form of a simple invocation of the Holy Spirit? Veni Sancte Spiritus [Come Holy Spirit]!" If you are afraid that some participants in the Synod hold heterodox views, pray even harder for them. Numerous people who were once greatly opposed to the Church's teaching on a variety of topics have come around to embrace them wholeheartedly.

Finally, hold fast to the virtue of charity. We are called to love the Church as a gift from God. Even when our fellow Catholics—including members of the hierarchy—give us reason to lament, we must resist the temptation to foster animosity against the Church herself. She is no mere human society; she is the mystical body of Christ endowed with real authority under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We are also called to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us (see Matt. 5:44)".

I invite you all to remain prayerful as the Mother Church undergoes this critical time of discernment and deliberations on various concerns that will significantly impact the Church's life and each of us.
