Building of God's Kingdom (Luke 13:1-9)

Dear beloved parishioners and Friends,

There is a well-known narrative that many may be familiar with. This story revolves around four people: Everybody, Somebody, Anybody, and Nobody. In the story, there is a very important job that has to be done. Everybody was asked to do it. But Everybody was sure that Somebody would do it. Everybody knew that it was a job that Anybody could do. But in the end, Nobody did it. Now, this caused Somebody to become quite angry because, after all, it was Everybody's job. But Everybody kept insisting, "Anybody can do it." And Nobody seemed to realise that Everybody would never do it. Only Somebody would.

Today's Gospel inspires us to be the Somebody who takes action. It highlights the vital task of building God's Kingdom. Each of us, through our baptism, is invited to partner with God in transforming the world. While Everyone is welcome to contribute, not everyone will choose to engage. That's why it falls on Somebody to step up and make a meaningful difference! Often, we may feel that since it's Everyone's responsibility or that Anyone can pitch in, we end up doing very little. Let's rise to the call to act and create positive change together!

This Gospel resonates deeply within us, emphasizing the power of taking action. It draws a poignant comparison to barren fig trees—those that yield no fruit despite the nurturing care they receive. In this metaphor, God is depicted as the patient gardener, tirelessly cultivating with the hope that somebody will step forward to help build God's Kingdom. The beauty lies in the fact that anyone can contribute to this sacred endeavour; it only takes one person to take that first step. Let's reflect on how we can be that somebody for positive change together.

This is the third Sunday of Lent, marking our journey through this meaningful season. As we reflect on the past two weeks, how many of us can recognise actions in our lives that have contributed to building God's Kingdom? Are we simply going through the motions, perhaps with a little less chocolate and alcohol? Today, I challenge each of you to identify one action—just one—that you can take to help build God's Kingdom. Choose an action that brings the world closer to unity, peace, and justice. It could be reaching out to a relative with whom you've lost touch and letting them know the door is open for reconciliation. Consider taking time to educate yourself on pressing political or social issues that impact our country and the world. Perhaps dedicating some of your time or energy to a group combating poverty or violence speaks to you. Or maybe it's about reaching out to a neighbour in need whom you've been meaning to help.

Now is the moment for action. It's time to take that first step and produce fruit, ensuring there's at least one fig on the branch of a once-barren tree. Every action we take contributes to building God's Kingdom. This is a collective effort—everybody has a role, and anybody is capable. But remember, somebody must take the initiative. That somebody is you.

NOTIZIE ITALIANE Domenica 23 Marzo 2025 (Luca 13, 1-9)

In quel tempo si presentarono alcuni a riferire a Gesù il fatto di quei Galilei, il cui sangue Pilato aveva fatto scorrere insieme a quello dei loro sacrifici. Prendendo la parola, Gesù disse loro: "Credete che quei Galilei fossero più peccatori di tutti i Galilei, per aver subito tale sorte? No, io vi dico, ma se non vi convertite, perirete tutti allo stesso modo. O quelle diciotto persone, sulle quali crollò la torre di Sìloe e le uccise, credete che fossero più colpevoli di tutti gli abitanti di Gerusalemme? No, io vi dico, ma se non vi convertite, perirete tutti allo stesso modo". Diceva anche questa parabola: "Un tale aveva piantato un albero di fichi nella sua vigna e venne a cercarvi frutti, ma non ne trovò. Allora disse al vignaiolo: "Ecco, sono tre anni che vengo a cercare frutti su quest'albero, ma non ne trovo. Tàglialo dunque! Perché deve sfruttare il terreno?". Ma quello gli rispose: "Padrone, lascialo ancora quest'anno, finché gli avrò zappato attorno e avrò messo il concime. Vedremo se porterà frutti per l'avvenire; se no, lo taglierai". Parola del Signore.

L'albero che non produce frutti non deve occupare inutilmente il terreno: "Taglialo!" ci sentiremo dire autorevolmente. Ma la Santa Quaresima, che stiamo vivendo, ci invita a una scelta diversa: alla conquista di una libertà piena e gioiosa, la libertà dei risorti, la libertà della Pasqua. Questa libertà è un dono gratuito, nato dall'infinito Amore di Dio, da Colui che si rivelò a Mosè in un roveto ardente di fuoco, che non si consuma. È Lui che, con amore instancabile, guarda la nostra miseria e scende per liberarci dal potere del male, per condurci dalla terra dell'esilio a una terra bella e spaziosa, dove scorrono latte e miele, dove la vita si compie nella comunione con Dio, nostro Creatore e Padre. Così si realizza in pienezza il progetto divino di salvezza: siamo riscattati e redenti. Dalla caduta nel peccato nel paradiso terrestre all'incarnazione del Verbo, fino alla sua passione, morte e risurrezione, la storia della salvezza risuona oggi con la stessa forza di sempre.
