First Reading - Isaiah 66.18-21

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

Thus says the Lord: "For I know their works and their thoughts, and I am coming to gather all nations and tongues; and they shall come and shall see my glory, and I will set a sign among them. "From them I will send survivors to the nations, to Tarshish, Put, and Lud—which draw the bow— to Tubal and Javan, to the coastlands far away that have not heard of my fame or seen my glory; and they shall declare my glory among the nations. "They shall bring all your kindred from all the nations as an offering to the Lord, on horses, and in chariots, and in litters, and on mules, and on dromedaries, to my holy mountain Jerusalem," says the Lord, "just as the Israelites bring a grain offering in a clean vessel to the house of the Lord." "And I will also take some of them as priests and as Levites," says the Lord

Second Reading - Hebrews 12.5-7, 11-13

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

And you have forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as children— "My child, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, or lose heart when you are punished by him; for the Lord disciplines those whom he loves, and chastises every child whom he accepts." Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as children; for what child is there whom a parent does not discipline? Now, discipline always seems painful rather than pleasant at the time, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed.

Gospel - Luke 13.22-30

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

Jesus went through one town and village after another, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus said to them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able. "When once the owner of the house has got up and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then in reply he will say to you, 'I do not know where you come from.' "Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets.' But the Lord will say, 'I do not know where you come from; go away from me, all you evildoers!' "There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrown out. Then people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will eat in the kingdom of God. "Indeed, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."

GOSPEL REFLECTION - Luke 13.22-30 (21st Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C)

People from east and west, north and south . . . will feast in the Kingdom of God.' Amongst those people, will there be Buddhists, Muslims, Hindus, atheists? The surprising answer of Catholic Christianity is: 'Yes, but always through the working of the Holy Spirit of Our Lord Jesus Christ, who can prompt the heart of any person anywhere at any time with divine grace so that that person strives to lead a life of compassion and justice and not harming innocent creatures.' Obviously, this work of the Holy Spirit could encompass millions if not billions of people who have never heard the Gospel. If the slogan: 'No salvation outside the Church' is taken to mean no-one can be saved unless he/she is a baptised member of the Catholic Church then it is a heresy explicitly condemned by Popes. Nevertheless, we must pray and work for the conversion of all people so that they might have the advantage of all the aids of Word and Sacrament which we draw on as direction and strength on our journey towards the destiny which God desires for each one of us. We could pause for a moment to acknowledge the boundless mercy of God, but also praying that all peoples might share our privilege of participating in that Holy Communion which is the foretaste of the banquet prophesied by Jesus in today's Gospel.

(Source: Pope Francis - Angelus, 25 August 2019)

In quel tempo, Gesù passava insegnando per città e villaggi, mentre era in cammino verso Gerusalemme. Un tale gli chiese: «Signore, sono pochi quelli che si salvano?». Disse loro: «Sforzatevi di entrare per la porta stretta, perché molti, io vi dico, cercheranno di entrare, ma non ci riusciranno. Quando il padrone di casa si alzerà e chiuderà la porta, voi, rimasti fuori, comincerete a bussare alla porta, dicendo: "Signore, aprici!". Ma egli vi risponderà: "Non so di dove siete". Allora comincerete a dire: "Abbiamo mangiato e bevuto in tua presenza e tu hai insegnato nelle nostre piazze". Ma egli vi dichiarerà: "Voi, non con di data e interestata di la contrata di contrata di la contrata di contra so di dove siete. Allontanatevi da me, voi tutti operatori di ingiustizia!". Là ci sarà pianto e stridore di denti, quando vedrete Abramo, Isacco e Giacobbe e tutti i profeti nel regno di Dio, voi invece cacciati fuori. Verranno da oriente e da occidente, da settentrione e da mezzogiorno e siederanno a mensa nel regno di Dio. Ed ecco, vi sono ultimi che saranno primi, e vi sono primi che Parola del Signore. saranno ultimi».

Gesù non vuole illuderci, dicendo: "Sì, state tranquilli, la cosa è facile, c'è una bella autostrada e in fondo un grande portone...". Non ci dice questo: ci parla della porta stretta. Ci dice le cose come stanno: il passaggio è stretto. In che senso? Nel senso che per salvarsi bisogna amare Dio e il prossimo, e questo non è comodo! È una "porta stretta" perché è esigente, l'amore è esigente sempre, richiede impegno, anzi, "sforzo", cioè una volontà decisa e perseverante di vivere secondo il Vangelo. San Paolo lo chiama «il buon combattimento della fede» (1Tm 6,12). Ci vuole lo sforzo di tutti i giorni, di tutto il giorno per amare Dio e il prossimo. Ci aiuti in questo la Vergine Maria. Lei è passata attraverso la porta stretta che è Gesù. Lo ha accolto con tutto il cuore e lo ha seguito ogni giorno della sua vita, anche quando non capiva, anche quando una spada trafiggeva la sua anima. Per questo la invochiamo come "Porta del cielo": Maria, Porta del cielo; una porta che ricalca esattamente la forma di Gesù: la porta del

cuore di Dio, cuore esigente, ma aperto a tutti noi
