A reading from the book of Sirach

The Lord is the judge, and with him there is no partiality. He will not show partiality to the poor but he will listen to the prayer of one who is wronged. The Lord will not ignore the supplication of the orphan, or the widow when she pours out her complaint. The one whose service is pleasing to the Lord will be accepted, and the prayer of such a person will reach to the clouds. The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds, and it will not rest until it reaches its goal; it will not desist until the Most High responds and does justice for the righteous, and executes judgment. Indeed, the Lord will not delay.

R. The Lord hears the cry of the poor.

I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul makes its boast in the Lord; let the humble hear and be glad. R.

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing. At my first defense no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Gospel - Luke 18.9-14

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous. and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income." "But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying,

'God,' be merciful to me, a sinner!' "I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

GOSPEL REFLECTION - Luke 18:9-14

This parable begins 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray'. But only one of them actually prayed: 'God be merciful to me, a sinner'. The other informs God how well he is doing in the piety stakes. Notice that he strings together a whole lot of verbs, all in the first person singular! This means he is in mortal danger of staying in the first person singular after death, which is Hellish. The other is said to be 'humble'. I like the English companion word: 'humus'. He is well-grounded, knows where he is standing, sometimes in the manure of life. It takes courage and humility to admit to God exactly where we stand. We can do so in Confession, or less formally simply praying: 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner'. We could pause for a moment to humbly pray so that we may hope to hear Our Lord say: 'This woman, this man, this boy, this girl, went © Fr Michael Tate; mtate@bigpond.com home at rights with God.'





30º Domenica - Anno C (Luca 18, 9-14.)

In quel tempo, Gesù disse ancora questa parabola per alcuni che avevano l'intima presunzione di essere giusti e disprezzavano gli altri: «Due uomini salirono al tempio a pregare: uno era fariseo e l'altro pubblicano. Il fariseo, stando in piedi, pregava così tra sé: "O Dio, ti ringrazio perché non sono come gli altri uomini, ladri, ingiusti, adùlteri, e neppure come questo pubblicano. Digiuno due volte alla settimana e pago le decime di tutto quello che possiedo". Il pubblicano invece, fermatosi a distanza, non osava nemmeno alzare gli occhi al cielo, ma si batteva il petto dicendo: "O Dio, abbi pietà di me peccatore". Io vi dico: questi, a differenza dell'altro, tornò a casa sua giustificato, perché chiunque si esalta sarà umiliato, chi invece si umilia sarà esaltato».

Parola del Signore

Il Vangelo della Liturgia odierna ci presenta una parabola che ha due protagonisti, un fariseo e un pubblicano, cioè un uomo religioso e un peccatore conclamato. Entrambi salgono al tempio a pregare, ma soltanto il pubblicano si eleva veramente a Dio, perché con umiltà scende nella verità di sé stesso e si presenta così com'è, senza maschere, con le sue povertà. Nell'umiltà, infatti, diventiamo capaci di portare a Dio, senza finzioni, ciò che realmente siamo, i limiti e le ferite, i peccati, le miserie che ci appesantiscono il cuore, e di invocare la sua misericordia perché ci risani, ci guarisca, ci rialzi. Sarà Lui a rialzarci, non noi. Più noi scendiamo con umiltà, più Dio ci fa salire in alto. Fratelli, sorelle, il fariseo e il pubblicano ci riguardano da vicino. Pensando a loro, guardiamo a noi stessi: verifichiamo se in noi, come nel fariseo, c'è «l'intima presunzione di essere giusti» che ci porta a disprezzare gli altri. Dove c'è troppo io, c'è poco Dio. Chiediamo l'intercessione di Maria Santissima, l'umile serva del Signore, immagine vivente di ciò che il Signore ama compiere, rovesciando i potenti dai troni e innalzando gli umili.
