First Reading: 2 Kings 4.8-12a, 14-17

A reading from the second book of Kings.

One day Elisha was passing through Shunem, where a wealthy woman lived, who urged him to have a meal. So whenever he passed that way, he would stop there for a meal. She said to her husband, "Look, I am sure that this man who regularly passes our way is a holy man of God. Let us make a small roof chamber with walls, and put there for him a bed, a table, a chair, and a lamp, so that he can stay there whenever he comes to us." One day when Elisha came there, he went up to the chamber and lay down there. He said to his servant Gehazi, "What then may be done for the woman?" Gehazi answered, "Well, she has no son, and her husband is old." Elisha said, "Call her." When the servant had called her, she stood at the door. Elisha said, "At this season, in due time, you shall embrace a son." She replied, "No, my lord, O man of God; do not deceive your servant." The woman conceived and bore a son at that season, in due time, as Elisha had declared to her.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 89.1-2, 15-16, 17-18, (R.1a)

R. For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

I will sing of your steadfast love, O Lord, forever; with my mouth I will proclaim your faithfulness to all generations. I declare that your steadfast love is established forever; your faithfulness is as firm as the heavens. **R.**

Happy are the people who know the festal shout, who walk, O Lord, in the light of your countenance; they exult in your name all day long, and extol your righteousness. **R.**

For you are the glory of their strength; by your favour our horn is exalted. For our shield belongs to the Lord, our king to the Holy One of Israel. **R.**

Second Reading: Romans 6.3-4, 8-11

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

My brothers and sisters: Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel: Matthew 10.37-42

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

Jesus called the twelve to him and sent them out with the following instructions: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. Whoever welcomes a prophet in the name of a prophet will receive a prophet's reward; and whoever welcomes a righteous person in the name of a righteous person will receive the reward of the righteous; and whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple—truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward."

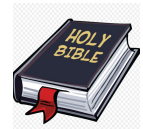

In quel tempo, disse Gesù ai suoi discepoli: "Chi ama il padre o la madre più di me non è degno di me; chi ama il figlio o la figlia più di me non è degno di me; chi non prende la sua croce e non mi segue, non è degno di me. Chi avrà trovata la sua vita, la perderà: e chi avrà perduto la sua vita per causa mia, la troverà. Chi accoglie voi accoglie me, e chi accoglie me accoglie colui che mi ha mandato. Chi accoglie un profeta come profeta, avrà la ricompensa del profeta, e chi accoglie un giusto come giusto, avrà la ricompensa del giusto. E chi avrà dato anche solo un bicchiere di acqua fresca a uno di questi piccoli, perché è mio discepolo, in verità io vi dico: non perderà la sua ricompensa".

Parola del Signore.

Gesù chiede ai suoi discepoli di prendere sul serio le esigenze evangeliche, anche quando ciò richiede sacrificio e fatica. Dice: «Chi ama padre o madre, figlio o figlia più di me non è degno di me». Gesù non intende di certo sottovalutare l'amore per i genitori e i figli, ma sa che i legami di parentela, se sono messi al primo posto, possono deviare dal vero bene. Lo vediamo: alcune corruzioni nei governi, vengono proprio perché l'amore alla parentela è più grande dell'amore alla patria, e mettono in carica i parenti. Quando invece l'amore verso i genitori e i figli è animato e purificato dall'amore del Signore, allora diventa pienamente fecondo e produce frutti di bene nella famiglia stessa e molto al di là di essa. «Chi non prende la propria croce e non mi segue, non è degno di me». Si tratta di seguirlo sulla via che Egli stesso ha percorso, senza cercare scorciatoie. Non c'è vero amore senza croce, cioè senza un prezzo da pagare di persona. E lo dicono tante mamme, tanti papà che si sacrificano tanto per i figli e sopportano dei veri sacrifici, delle croci, perché amano. E portata con Gesù, la croce non fa paura, perché Lui è sempre al nostro fianco per sorreggerci nell'ora della prova più dura, per darci forza e coraggio.
