The Most Holy Trinity - Year A

First Reading: Exodus 34.4b-6, 8-9

A reading from the book of Exodus.

GOSPEL REFLECTION - THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

When he was crucified Jesus uttered: 'It is finished.' What had finished? His earthly ministry during which he painted a picture of the most intimate communion between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, so intimate that the Church needed a new word: 'Tri-Unity' or 'Trinity' for short. God is pulsating, shimmering light, dancing in threefold exchange of love, each being simultaneously poured into the other. God is 'Being-In-Love' and love is always relational. You are made in the image and likeness of God. Because of the ministry of Jesus Christ, we know what that really means. We are made to live in relationship – not in solitary. If we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient/autonomous, that leads to a hellish existence. When we live with as much self-giving as is possible, we are on the way to a heavenly existence. We could pause for a moment to give thanks for the revelation of the nature of God, and consequently of the true nature of human beings.

NOTIZIE ITALIANE

Domenica 31 Maggio 2026

Santissima Trinità Anno A - Giovanni 3, 16-18 (estratto)

In quel tempo, disse Gesù a Nicodèmo: «Dio ha tanto amato il mondo da dare il Figlio, unigenito, perché chiunque crede in lui non vada perduto, ma abbia la vita eterna. Dio, infatti, non ha mandato il Figlio nel mondo per condannare il mondo, ma perché il mondo si salvi per mezzo di lui. Chi crede in lui non è condannato; ma chi non crede è già stato condannato, perché non ha creduto nel nome dell'unigenito Figlio di Dio». **Parola del Signore.**

Oggi, Solennità della Santissima Trinità, il Vangelo è tratto dal dialogo di Gesù con Nicodemo. Nicodemo era un membro del Sinedrio, appassionato del mistero di Dio: riconosce in Gesù un maestro divino e di nascosto, di notte, va a parlare con Lui. Gesù lo ascolta, capisce che è un uomo in ricerca e allora prima lo stupisce, rispondendogli che per entrare nel Regno di Dio bisogna rinascere; poi gli svela il cuore del mistero dicendo che Dio ha amato così tanto l'umanità da mandare il suo Figlio nel mondo. Gesù, dunque, il Figlio, ci parla del Padre e del suo amore immenso. Padre e Figlio. È un'immagine familiare che, se ci pensiamo, scardina il nostro immaginario su Dio. La parola stessa "Dio", infatti, ci suggerisce una realtà singolare, maestosa e distante, mentre sentir parlare di un Padre e di un Figlio ci riporta a casa. Sì, possiamo pensare Dio così, attraverso l'immagine di una famiglia riunita a tavola, dove si condivide la vita. Del resto, quella della mensa, che allo stesso tempo è un altare, è un simbolo con cui certe icone raffigurano la Trinità. È un'immagine che ci parla di un Dio comunione. Padre, Figlio e Spirito Santo: comunione. Ma non è solo un'immagine, è realtà! È realtà perché lo Spirito Santo, lo Spirito che il Padre mediante Gesù ha effuso nei nostri cuori, ci fa gustare, ci fa assaporare la presenza di Dio: presenza sempre vicina, compassionevole e tenera.
